### Local Law #1 January 2008

Whereas: Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law allows for the granting of an exemption on Town taxes based on limited income for residents over the age of 65. And Whereas, the limit has not been changed for many years.

Therefore: The Town of Forestport now accepts an income level of \$15,000 for a 50% exemption prorated at 5% intervals with a maximum income of \$22,500.

# LOCAL LAW NO. 1 FOR THE YEAR 2008, TOWN OF FORESTPORT GRANTING EXEMPTION ON TOWN TAXES BASED ON LIMITED INCOME FOR RESIDENTS OVER THE AGE OF 65

WHEREAS Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law allows for the granting of an exemption on Town taxes based on limited income for residents over the age of 65; and

WHEREAS the limit has not been changed for many years.

NOW, THEREFORE be it enacted that the Town of Forestport shall grant an exemption on Town property taxes for individuals owning real property in the Town who are over the age of 65 as of the taxable status date. This exemption shall be as follows:

- (a) if the property owners income is less than \$15,000.00, there shall be a 50% reduction in Town property taxes;
- (b) if the property owners income is at least \$15,000.00 but less than \$15,750.00, there shall be a 45% reduction in Town property taxes;
- (c) if the property owners income is at least \$15,750.00 but less than \$16,500.00, there shall be a 40% reduction in Town property taxes;
- (d) if the property owners income is at least \$16,500.00 but less than \$17,250.00, there shall be a 35% reduction in Town property taxes;
- (e) if the property owners income is at least \$17,250.00 but less than \$18,000.00, there shall be a 30% reduction in Town property taxes;
- (f) if the property owners income is at least \$18,750.00 but less than \$19,500.00, there shall be a 25% reduction in Town property taxes;
- (g) if the property owners income is at least \$19,500.00 but less than \$20,250.00, there shall be a 20% reduction in Town property taxes;
- (h) if the property owners income is at least \$20,250.00 but less than \$21,000.00, there shall be a 15% reduction in Town property taxes;
- (i) if the property owners income is at least \$21,000.00 but less than \$21,750.00, there shall be a 10% reduction in Town property taxes;
- (j) if the property owners income is at least \$21,750.00 but less than \$22,500.00, there shall be a 5% reduction in Town property taxes.
