Councilman Karn inquired if the Town of Remsen and/or Ohio had placed moratoriums on hydrofracking. He wondered about their positions due to their proximity to Forestport.

Supervisor Hasenauer stated that the Dump parcel had been appraised at \$10,000 and the Town will advertise the parcel for sale publicly. Mr. Douglas Reidman stated that the Town does not have to advertise the sale according to his attorney. An outright sale is possible, and he stated his attorney would contact Mr. Riley concerning the matter.

Councilman Seager made a motion to adopt the Cornell Cooperative Extension's guidelines regarding Backyard Poultry and Livestock until the Site Review Law can address the issue. Councilwoman Nancy Kardash seconded the motion. Roll call vote:
