Section 1. Resolved, That a fire district be, and the same is, hereby created and established in the unincorporated willage of Forestport County of Oneida and State Oof New York, which shall be known as Fire District No. 1 of the town of For stport and is bounded and de cribed as follows and in-Shi cludes all the territory and taxable property inssendstrict

Survey of a fire District in the village of Forestport, town of Forest port, Oneida County, N.Y.

Beginning on the westerly side of State Pond at a post standing in water about 12 feet from the more opposite to a maple tree marked on Kernan's point and running from thence across the said State Pond on a course N. 81 deg. Section 2. The officers of such district shall be three fire commissioners and a treasurer and shall hold their respective offices as prescribed in section 6 herein. No person shall be eligible to either of said of fices unless he shall be at the time, a resident and elector of such district and own property liable to be assessed for the expenditures of such district. Whenever any of such officers shall cease to be a resident of such district his office shall become vacant. If there shall be a vacancy in such offices the board of town a ditors of said town, may fill the same, for

Such treasurer shall receive and have the costody of the funds or moneys of said distret and pay out the same for the purposes herein mentioned, upon the order of the fire commissioners or a majority of them.

fection 6. The Treasurer shall hold his office for the term of three years and until his successor shall be elected or appointed and qualified, except that the treasurer first

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elected under this act shell hold his office until June 30th, 1894, and until his successor shell be elected or appointed and and qualified. The term of the treasurer shall thereafter begin on the first day of July next succeeding his election, The fire convissioners first elected under this act shall be divided into three classed, consisting of one condisioner cach, to hold their offices respectively for one, two and three years from July 1st, 1891, the conmissioners determining among themselves by lot, who shall hold office for the term of one year therefrom, who for the term of two years therefrom a nd who for the term of three years therefrom, and the term of all fire commissioners thereafter elected shally be three years from the first day of July next succeeding their election and until their successors shall be elected or a pointed and q ualified.

Section 7. The fire commissioners and treasurer stall not, directly or indirectly, be paid or receive any compensation for their services as such.

their number, one who shell be chairman and another of their number to be Clark and all their acts, expenditures, receipts, and priceedings as such fire consissioners, shall be duly recorded by them, in a book to be kept for that purpose, which shall be ateall times subject to the inspection of the supervisor of said town. A report shall be made by the fire commissioners to the electors at the annual election in said district, showing the receipts, disbursements, acts and proceedings of said commissioners for the year then ending. An estimate of the money required during the ensuing

year, for the purposes of said district, shall be made by said commissioners and notices/posted in at least three public places in said district, one week prior to the annual-Aelection therein, to the effect that an application will be made at said annual election for a vote suthorizing the raising of such as they may deem necessary for such purposes, which sum shall be specified in such notice. The vote on such application shall be by ballot and only retident taxpayers of said district, whose names appear on the last proceeding assessment roll of said term town, shall be elets eligible eligible to vote thereon. If the said electors shall by their votes determine that the amount applied for by the commissioners, or that any other amount designated on a majority of the be llots (but not exceeding the amount specified in said notice) shall be raised, the clerk of said election shall certify such vote to the supervisor of said town, who shall lay the same before the Board of Supervisors, at their next annual meeting, and it shall be their duty to cause the amount so specified to be levied and collected upon such district in the same manner at the same time & by the same officers as the taxes of said town are assessed, levied and collected.

Said commissioners and said fire district are hereby autohized to procue a supply of water and to purchase apparatus for the extinguishment of fires in said district, to ment or purchase suitable brildings for the keeping and storing of the same, to take title to and to hold in trust for said district all properties that may be acquired for, or by said district for the purposes aforesaid and to make all contracts for

the aforesaid surposes, within the appropriations voted by the resident texpayers of said district.

trict may be called by said commissioners to vote on the question of raising and appropriating additional moneys for the fire purposes aforesaid. The same notice shall be given by the commissioners thereof as required by section 7 hereof, the voting shall be by bellot and the qualifications of the voters shall be the same as mentioned in section 7. The said voters shall have the same powers to vote the amount applied for by the commissioners or a less amount to be designated by them on their ballots, and the derk of said special meeting shall certify the vote to the AMA Board of Supervisors and the anounts so voted shall be levied, assessed and collected in the same manner, at the same time and by the same officers as is designated by section 7 for appropriations made at the annual election or meeting.

resolution, the town clerk of said town, shall give notice and post the same in five public places in such district that on a stated and at a place named in such district, and between certain hours, an election will be held for the election of three fire commissioners and a treasurer for such district.

Such notice shall be posted at least ten days before the time for holding such election. Such election shall be held for at least the space of three hours interruptedly, between ten o'clock in the foremon and four o'clock in the afternoon and the motice of election shall state the hours of opening and closing the polls and the name of the officers to be filled.

SECTION 12. The amual election in said district shall be held on June 15th of each and every year hereafter, beginning June 15th 1892. The terms of office of the fire commissioners first elected hereunder, shall begin on the day of their election and end as proved in section 6.

SECTION 13. No property shall be entitled to the protection of, or liable to be assessed, or taxed, for the support of any fire department of such village unless the same lies
