WHEREAS, on the 24th day of August, 1988, an extension of the County Sales and Use Tax for an additional two year period from December 1, 1988 to November 30, 1990 for the County of Oneida was passed by the Board of County Legislators, Oneida County, and

WHEREAS, said resolution, as well as Section 1262(c) of the Tax

Law provides that all cities, villages and towns within the County

of Oneida may elect by resolution to receive a direct payment of the

amounts which would otherwise be applied to reduce County taxes and

general taxes upon real property in such towns, cities or villages, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Forestport has elected to be paid directly as provided for in said Resolution and as provided for in Section 1262(c) of the Tax Law of the State of New York, now, therefore, be it hereby

RESOLVED, by the Town of Forestport, New York, that any and all proceeds from the sales tax imposed by the County of Oneida which are allocated to the Town of Forestport, be paid directly to the Town of Forestport, pursuant to Section 1262(c) of the Tax Law and also pursuant to the Resolution 212 of the County of Oneida imposing a county sales tax, and it is further

RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall only be effective for the calendar year or years subsequent to enactment and shall only be effective if it is mailed by registered or certified mail to the chief fiscal officer of the County of Oneida and shall remain in effect until it is rescinded.



On August 24, 1988, the Oneida County Board of Legislators extended the above referenced County Sales and Use Tax of 3% for an additional two year period from December 1, 1988 to November 30, 1990.

This affects your municipality directly and requires affirmative action by your Board or Council if you desire to obtain the funds due you directly. This must be done within thirty days from the date of the passage (August 24, 1988) and no later than September 23, 1988.

Your municipality acted on this question approximately two years ago as to the present sales tax and you are going to have to pass another Board Resolution for the Sales Tax extension period within the time frame as above stated and send a copy of the Resolution to the Oneida County Comptroller.

Please consult with your municipal attorney and if you wish the present payment plan to continue then you should adopt a resolution in the same form as your previous one.

This is a matter of great concern and importance and should not be delayed or prolonged.
