RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the Adirondack Park Agency Act Article 27 creating the Adirondack Park Agency appears to violate the intentions of the State and Federal Constitutions; and

WHEREAS this Agency has usurped power rightfully belonging to local governments; and

Whereas there is no real need for such an Agency as there already exists too much government and too many insensitive bureaucratic agencies; and

Whereas the economy is restricted, the tax base is decreased, and private land owners are deprived of their rights and full use of their land without compensation; and

Whereas these experimental, overly severe land controls are not wanted by those who bear the burden of this law;

NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED, that the TOWN BOARD

of FORESTPORT petition the Legislature and Governor of the State of New York to abolish and repeal the Adirondack Park Agency Act Article 27, and that an Adirondack Park Local Government Planning and Control Board be authorized to replace the Adirondack Park Agency.
