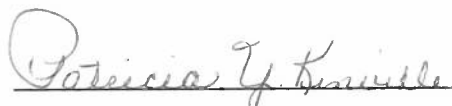

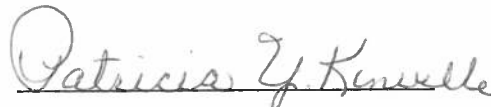
R E S O L U T I O N
